

Ron Pearson passed away at his home on December 19, 2013 at the age of 83. He suffered from a brain tumor and lung cancer but was fairly active until the last 6-7 months.

Ron is survived by his wife, Helen, daughter Colleen, son Randy and 5 grandchildren.

Ron worked as a Mechanical Engineer before starting his own business in 1963 specializing in Photo Chemical Machining. He sold the business to his daughter in 1998.

Ron and his wife Helen joined SGVR in March 2007 and rapidly became active in Region activities, including volunteering at the annual Festival of Speed. Ron enjoyed road trips with the Club but always managed to come in last at a Rally. Ron bought his first Porsche, 1968 912, with the idea of rebuilding it and entering the Carrera Panamericana Mexican Road Race with a buddy. After flying down to the Mexico and Guatemala border to watch the start of the race, they realized this was a big buck race and they were outclassed. So they decided to stay home, drink beer and talk about it.

In October 2007, Ron decided to sign up for the annual AutoBahn Adventure where he was able to drive a brand new Carrera S for 10 days through Germany and Switzerland. After that experience he was not satisfied with the 912. Thus, came the Boxster S, first a 2007 model and later a 2012.

Up until his death in December 2013, Ron loved his Boxster and his 912 and took every opportunity to get on the road, be it to the 912 Rendezvous in Cambria and Morro Bay or the Porsche Parade in Salt Lake City.

Porsche has released some new details about their Los Angeles Experience Center.

From: Porsche and Automotive News.

Currently under construction, the 53 acre site is located in Carson, California and will enable visitors to hit the track in everything from a Boxster to a 911. As Porsche North America CEO Detlev von Platen told *Automotive News*, "It will be a high-performance training center, where enthusiasts can experience and drive the car in all the conditions you normally couldn't get in the real world."

The track will have a modular design which will enable the company to create a variety of courses ranging from 0.5 to 2.0 miles (0.8 to 3.2 km). The company will also allow visitors to drive their own car on the track and then compare it to a Porsche.

Besides the track, the complex will have a Human Performance Center that offers "customized programs to maximize personal fitness and wellness for race car drivers and endurance athletes." There will also be a family-friendly cafe, and upscale restaurant and a conference center that can be used for business or motorsport events. The facility will also be the home to Porsche Motorsport North America and have a factory-backed maintenance and restoration area.

The Los Angeles Experience Center is expected to open in late 2014.



The 2014 L. A. Lit and Toy Show

The 2014 LitMeet, more properly the L. A. Literature and Toy Show, has come and gone. The LitMeet's a huge swap meet and trade show that takes over the Los Angeles Airport Hilton Hotel's ballrooms on the first Saturday of March. It's also the anchor event of a long weekend of open houses, tours, and a gathering at the Phoenix Club. The whole weekend draws folks from around the country and around the world.

The 2014 LitMeet long weekend (27 February through 2 March 2014) just happened to arrive in Los Angeles with a weather pattern that dumped several inches of rain.

There's far too much for one person to take in, so here's an account of what I did over the weekend.

Thursday, 27 Feb. Sierra Madre Collection Open House

I drove over to Sierra Madre Collection in Pasadena, had a cheeseburger and tried to buy a replacement interior light for my 356A. The light I wanted was out of stock (the one in a Porsche box was available for twice the price) but I did get an acid-neutralizing battery pad.

I also got to see the new 100 Dollar Bill. To prepare for the LitMeet a fellow shopper had withdrawn a few stacks of brand new, consecutively numbered, \$100 and \$50 bills. Some people take the LitMeet very seriously.

Friday, 28 Feb.

Facing a combination of heavy rain and Los Angeles traffic, I descoped my open house plans a bit. I also hit the road later than I should have.

Willhoit Auto Restoration

I got to Willhoit's in long Beach at lunch time and ran into fellow San Gabriel Valley Region member Mike d'Andrea. John Willhoit charges high prices but every car he sends into the world is undeniably gorgeous. The shop was full of those gorgeous cars, one of which was soon to leave for the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance.

Klasse 356

My final stop was Callas Rennsport, a little ways up Hawthorne venue from Klasse 356. While I've done business with Johnson alignment in the same complex, I'd never visited Callas. Tony Callas had an ultra-rare 911R up on a lift and he was doing a little work at the left front. I also got to meet the owner. There was also a 959 up on a lift displaying its exotic underpinnings with three more out in the rain by a Carrera GT. There was another 911R somewhere.





Saturday, 1 March The Lit Meet

Prescott Kelly, Wayne Callaway, and Jim Perrin have been putting on the LitMeet for years and it does indeed draw both sellers and buyers from around the world. When I first attended back in maybe 1998 you could walk the aisles and look through stacks of Porsche literature, decide where you could find the best value then circle back to make the deal.


Now, there's still Porsche literature but it no longer fills most of the tables. A lot of the sellers are there more to show off services and forge customer relationships than to actually sell at the event. The year, the LitMeet overflowed <u>both</u> ballrooms and there were a few tables out in the halls.

I hadn't planned to spend much money but Aase Sales had some new products I had to have. Way back when I had the air cleaner in my '65 911 powder coated I thought then vendor parts catalogs were correct when they said they had the right firing order and valve clearance sticker. I threw out the old one then

found out the new one's weren't available (until recently). At \$42, Aase's new sticker wasn't a big bargain but it was an indispensable detail...



Aase is also making new exhaust systems for the early 911 Webasto gasoline-fired heater. A complete set would have been \$750, but I was lucky enough to have the expensive parts already. For another \$75 I got the short pipe that foes from the heater to its muffler and the gaskets and things to put the parts together.

I spotted Porsche Factory Race Driver Patrick Long at the LitMeet.

356 Registry Membership Meeting

The 356 Registry held a membership meeting after the LitMeet wound down. It was more a chance to talk to the directors than to conduct business. Among the topics:

- . The long dragged out lawsuit. A [former] member's suing to have personal data for all the members turned over to him,
- . How best to use the 356 Registry website to attract new members,
- . Tom Tate from *Typ 356 Northeast* gave the surprising news that only about 2/3 of his regional club's members also belonged to the 356 Registry. He had expected closer to 95% before running a poll.

Carparc USA

Carparc USA in Costa Mesa has an earlier open house in Costa Mesa than Jim Liberty or European Collectibles to attract folks who've come straight from the LitMeet. They specialize in early 911s and had at least three '65s (one was a '64 build) in the very clean shop. Thanks to the wet weather they also had a lot of people crowded between the cars. If my high school German skills had been good enough to practice there were plenty of native German speakers.

I was one of three people gathered around an old 911 engine which still had the once-reviled Solex 40PI floatless carbs and center-lubricated camshafts. The other two gentlemen sort of concluded the going rate for a set would be in the \$4,000 range.

Back in the day, many owners decided to end all the Solex carburetion problems-real or imagined-by switching to Webers. Now that the first 911s are worth a lot in original condition, people are looking for those discarded Solexes. It's not just carburetors, the Solex carbs don't share the manifold, air cleaner, or throttle linkage with the later Webers. They also need a unique "tandem" mechanical fuel pump which drives off the left camshaft nut and a hard double fuel line that attaches to the fan shroud and feeds the right side carburetors.

Liberty Motorsports

I drove a half mile or so and parked a little way from Liberty Motorsports and European Collectibles. The rain was pretty much gone but I splashed through some puddles.

Liberty Motorsports is in a little industrial park across the street from European Collectibles, Liberty Motorsports is quite a few doors away from the street. There was another Porsche business on the end by the street which was open for visitors (but not announced).

Jim Liberty served some delicious Kirkland sandwiches, and-under the vigilant gaze of Constable Dudley Do-Right, some actual malted barley beverages.

The most notable car on the floor was the new shop truck: a black and red custom Binz ¹ Double-Cab Volkswagen Transporter. Like a lot of custom VW

¹ Volkswagen turned out a variety of transporters, but had the crew cab version done by an independent coach builder, Binz.

Transporters, Jim Liberty's has a highly-enhanced VW Type 4¹ engine. A lot of custom VW Transporters seem to go down the same path, but this was the first one I'd seen with a pre-A 356 dashboard and red Speedster front seats.

Jim Liberty's wife Tiffany is the daughter of the late Jay Ward, co-creator of *Rocky and Bullwinkle*. A lot of the shop's devoted to managing the *Rocky and Bullwinkle* legacy. Constable Do-Right of the RCMP isn't the only character in the collection. The Liberties were doubly busy getting ready for the LitMeet, the 356 Registry meeting (Jim's a trustee), and the premier of *Mr*.

Peabody & Sherman. It opens in theaters everywhere on Friday, 7 March 2014.

European Collectibles is a big classic car dealer and restorer across the street. Sunday, 2 March 2014

The Phoenix Club has a big tent, the *Festhalle*, which held most of the vendors. The swap meet sellers, including San Gabriel Valley Region President Alfred Abken and his sister, Kathy Morales, were out in damp parking lots.





One of the regulars of the 356 Club of Southern California's Monthly Run to Flo's Airport Cafe is also a long time member of the Phoenix Club. He showed up a little late in the day (he didn't drive one of his Porsches). He insisted on buying me a beer. It seemed like a good idea at the time, but it was a dark beer which proved surprisingly strong. I had to recover for a while before I could even think about leaving.

Non-Display Parking

The 2013 Phoenix Club Swap Meet had complaints

about expensive, distant parking. This year, there was supposed to be plentiful parking "50 meters from the main entrance" but the weather-depressed turnout may not have given the improved parking much of a test.

Conclusion

The rain may have dampened some local participation in open houses and kept old Porsches away from the Phoenix Club's soccer field, but the LitMeet Weekend continues to grow. It's a world renowned celebration of classic Porsches (and to some extent, VWs). If you attend, you might just find something you absolutely have to have.



SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP COORDINATOR

The Special Interest Group Coordinator, also known as "Register Coordinator," is responsible for the growth and development of the PCA sub-interest groups or "Registers" of specific model automobiles. The Coordinator is appointed by the Executive Council.

The primary mission of the PCA Register Coordinator is to encourage cross-Region and cross-Zone member communication with an interest in particular Porsche models, and to foster these member connections by providing a forum and organizational support. It is believed that such forums encourage membership with PCA as a whole, by offering contact between owners of unique-series Porsches, which otherwise might not occur. Registers offer potential benefits to PCA in three ways: 1) Through historic displays at Parade and elsewhere, 2) Providing articles for possible distribution via PCA media outlets, and 3) As a means of exchanging model-specific information regarding restoration, maintenance, parts, repair, and education.

The health and well being of the register and their advocates must be closely supervised by the Register Coordinator. Registers must have at the minimum a webpage as a means of communication to the members.

An important aspect of the Register Coordinator role is to solicit, collect, and edit articles from various Register Advocates to distribute to the membership via PCA media outlets including *Panorama*, www.pca.org, e-Brake News, and other social or online media outlets. For example, articles can feature a newly formed Register, report on a Register event, or elaborate on a Register that is already functioning. The Coordinator also maintains and updates the contact information for each Register Advocate in *Panorama* and on www.pca.org. The goal of PCA is to not only continue and enhance the current Registers, but to create new Registers as interest is generated (e.g., four-door models such as the Cayenne, Panamera and Macan). Acting as the Register Coordinator may involve a considerable time commitment, especially during formation of new registers, or for general maintenance of the large group of registers that currently exist. The most important requirement of the position: be available, be visible and respond in a timely manner to member's concerns. The coordinator position includes travel to PCA Board of Directors meeting twice a year and may include travel to select Registry events per year. In addition to the above tasks, the Coordinator will be responsible for:

- 1. Responding to all Registry related inquiries. The Registry Coordinator is the "face" of the PCA Special Interest Group program, and as such, must interface with any questions, problems and concerns that arise from the specific registries.
- 2. Appointing specific registry advocates as necessary due to occasional turnover.
- 3. Acting as manager for formation of new registries, including selecting the register advocate and training the new advocate to do such tasks as creation of the registry website, mailing lists, logo, etc.
- 4. Attending the Winter and Summer National Board of Directors (BOD) meetings. Note the Winter BOD typically occurs in February and the Summer BOD occurs during Parade.
- 5. Submitting Quarterly reports.
- 6. Operating to an annual budget approved by the Executive Council.
- 7. Participating in any National activities that may affect and/or improve the Registry program.
